October is a month full of "big-name" female saints--Therese of Lisieux, Teresa of Avila, Marguerite Marie Alacoque, and Mary Faustina Kowalska, to name a few. They all have inspiring stories, but I'd like to introduce you to Blessed Chiara Badano, who died of a rare form of bone cancer in 1990, just before her 19th birthday. Chiara was beautiful inside and out, and had been very involved in Focolare, an international ecumenical movement. Chiara showed people how to die, comforting other patients as well as her friends and family, and praying for others. "For you, Jesus," Chiara said. "If you want it, I want it too." Her feast day is October 29, her birthday.
