His wife, Maria, was a writer, nurse, teacher, and speaker. They were married for more than forty years, and raised four children. For those heroic virtues and their intercession in the healing of a man's circulatory disorder, the Quattrocchis in 2001 became the first married couple to be beatified together. Their feast day is their anniversary, November 25.
