Josephine Bakhita, born in the Sudan, was kidnapped by slave traders before she was ten. One of those who enslaved her had Josephine tattooed everywhere but her face. Eventually, she successfully fought for her freedom and was a Canossian nun for fifty years. Was she bitter? To the contrary, Josephine said she was grateful to the slave traders, for without them, she would not have the opportunity to become a Christian.

Josephine's feast day is February 8, the day she appears in my book

<u>Sisterhood of Saints: Daily Guidance and</u> Inspiration.

I especially enjoyed the way Dr. Sri drew out the similarities in language within Mary's key moments, including the wrapping and laying of the infant Jesus at the Nativity and the wrapping and laying of her crucified son in the tomb.
