# St. Louise de Marillac on Waiting Peacefully

Waiting. It doesn't always get easier with age or faith. I recently talked with a priest about this, and he recommended I contemplate on the Blessed Virgin, who trusted in the Lord even as she pondered in her heart what all these changes meant.



Lately, I've also been turning to St. Louise de Marillac, cofounder of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. The two of them are pictured here on a Croatian postage stamp.

Louise spent much of her early life in sorrow or in waiting: Her mother died when she was very young and her father, when she was four or so, sent her to board with an aunt and other

Dominican sisters. Louise wanted to be a Capuchin nun, but was not accepted due to her health. She married when she was twenty-two, then her husband died twelve years later. Shortly after he died, Louise met Vincent de Paul, and the rest is history. While their friendship was not always easy, Louise brought personal knowledge of life's injustices to the relationship, and Vincent helped her find inner peace.

Here's what Louise had to say about waiting: "I will tell you quite simply that we must wait peacefully for grace to produce true humility in us by revealing our

powerlessness to us."

Louise is one of the four women saints I'm featuring in the chapter on mourning in my book in progress, *Rejoice and Be Glad: Living the Beatitudes with the Women Saints.* I'm savoring every minute I carve out to be with her and the other ladies.


