### **Women Saints of the Americas**

Later this month, I'll be sharing a brief profile of St. Maria Guadalupe Garcia Zavala, co-founder of the Handmaids of St. Margaret Mary and the Poor in Mexico. Madre Lupita, as she was known, died in 1963 and was canonized in May 2013. What speaks to me about Madre Lupita is that the only "side" she took was the Lord's. The congregation's hospital was a haven for priests during the early twentieth century when Catholics were persecuted in Mexico. But the hospital also cared for government soldiers who were injured, who in turn later protected the hospital when it came under attack. Madre Lupita reminds me that not only are we called to love our enemies, we also need to stop and consider whether people truly are our enemies and view disharmony as an opportunity for evangelization and reconciliation.
