Hildegard, one of the first female Austrian Parliament members, was born to non-practicing Jewish parents. She and her husband both converted to Catholicism in their late twenties after Hildegard survived a major health scare. It was not long after that that Hildegard was advised to end a pregnancy due to her health history. She refused, and the couple's only daughter was born in 1910.

Hildegard's advocacy for women and children caused the Christian Socialist Party to ask her to run for the National Assembly. There, she spearheaded passage of a law setting minimum wages and working conditions for household workers. She decided not to seek re-election in 1920, due to her health and an undercurrent that was building against those of Jewish ethnicity. But her ministry did not end. She founded a group of women religious and lay associates to assist women living on society's margins.

Hildegard's story reminds me that serving the Lord and His people isn't about how we define ourselves politically. It's about seeing a need... and having the faith to meet it with His help.




On the Nightstand: Created to Relate
